#### **Class Placements:**

Families will be receiving a message via email, over the weekend from the Board providing you with the name of your child's teacher. If you miss it, or it doesn't come through, don't worry, we will have staff prepared with class lists in our school yard on Tuesday morning to help you out.

### **Tuesday morning:**

We ask all students and parents to make their way to the back school yard on Tuesday morning. We will help all students find their teachers. The teachers will have signs with their name to make it easier, especially for those new to our community. Please do not hesitate to approach any staff member for help. We will all be wearing yellow vests.

### **School Day and Kiss and Ride:**

Our school day commences at 8:45. Students will be able to enter the school as of 8:30 each morning and will be asked to make their way to their classroom. All students will enter the school through the side door closest to the driveway entrance of our school. Parents who are driving are asked to drive their children up to the front of the school so staff supervising the Kiss and Ride are present to assist children exiting cars and making their way to the sidewalk. Please avoid pulling over to drop children off at the entrance to the parking lot, as this significantly backs up traffic. If you wish to park and walk your children to their entrance, you are welcome to do so.

Students will be dismissed at 3:15. Primary students should be picked up on the school grounds for parents who have walked or parked the car. All students being picked up by car are asked to walk around to the front of the school to line up on the sidewalk and wait for their ride. No students will be picked up past the gate near the rear parking lot.

All our Kindergarten students are to be dropped off and picked up at their gate at the front of the school.

#### **Reporting Student Absences**

Student absences should be reported by parents/guardians for each student in our school though the Safe Arrival system in School Messenger. There are three ways to access the program:

Student absences not reported will trigger phone calls to confirm the absence each morning. If you need assistance, please contact the school.

### **Student Agenda's**

Students from Grades 1-6 will be given hard copies of the Student Agenda. It is a useful tool not only for organization but also for communication between home and school. Our intermediate students will have access to an online agenda.

#### **Student Lunches:**

Please make sure your children come to school with their lunch. Our intermediate students (grade 7 and 8 only) may bring a note to sign-out for lunch. Please ensure the note is dated with the appropriate date. Students can then go out to eat but are asked to not bring food or drinks back to school. Students will not be able to go back to their class until the bell rings again at 12:56 to signal the start of our afternoon classes.

## **Allergens:**

Please make sure you are sending your children to school each day with lunches that are free from allergens including Nuts, Tree nuts, Pumpkin, and Seafood. We have many children in our school who have serious allergies to these allergens, some of whom are airborne allergies. Information about the specific allergens in your children's classes will also be sent home in a letter and indicated on the classroom door. We thank you in advance for your attention to this as you pack lunches.

# **Breakfast Club:**

Our Breakfast Club will return this year, but we will not be ready for the first few weeks of school as we get organized and wait for grocery deliveries. The official date start will be communicated with our families in a future Weekend Update.

In exciting news, President's Choice Children's Charities has chosen our school to participate in a special CP24 Live Eye on Thursday, September 12<sup>th</sup>. We will be sending home more information as well as media consent forms on the first day of school. Please make sure these are returned to the school for our records. Students without media consent will not be permitted to be seen on -camera that day.

### **Water Bottles:**

As we are a Platinum Eco School, we remind students to bring a reusable water bottle to school each day. We have water filling stations for their bottles to be refilled but we do not have any disposable cups for students to fill.

# **Dress for the Weather:**

Please be mindful of the weather conditions and dress children appropriately. September is often still a hot month; students are encouraged to bring a hat and sunscreen if they can apply it themselves. As the weather starts to change, students are encouraged to wear layers for the cooler mornings and warmer afternoons. Students will be asked to have indoor shoes at school, especially once the weather changes as wet and soiled boots and shoes will remain in the hallways to keep the classrooms clean!

## **Board Communication: Welcome to the new School Year**

I am attaching the Board Communication that was sent earlier this week to all families along with the Weekend Update. In this communication are important messages, including information about recently passed policies regarding cellphones, and vaping. Please note that if students are bringing cellphones to school, they will be required to stay in student backpacks turned off (or on silent).
